- Flushed hydrants in Shiloh Ridge
- Sewer plant on winter clarifier
- Decorating trees, wreaths, lamp posts
- Tractor for downtown snow removal and street sweeping is ready

ENGINEER REVIEW

- **Remington Grove –Phase 1** have reached all the things on the punch list and close to being accepted.
- **Running Brook Farm** did punch list and walk through to see what items need to be done
- **Church Street Project** submitted to Council of Mayors and came in one of the top ranked projects for 2017 – 2019 funding cycle. Will be starting on Phase 1 & 2 in 2015 and 2016.
- Discussion of snow mobile usage.

OLD BUSINESS

Chairman McEvoy stated that the street by Bald Knob Rd and Pitzen are very dark and should have street lighting. Tim Hartnett suggested that the Village Administrator should send a request to our ComEd rep and see about getting one installed since it is a safety issue.
