

**Village Board Report – May 2013** *Welcome to the Village Board Report which is placed on our website monthly to keep you informed of actions taken by the Village Board on ordinances and other significant matters.*

**Oaths of Office** – At the May 2, 2013 meeting, the oaths of office were administered to President Edwin Hettermann and Trustees John Huemann, Kevin McEvoy and Greg Klemstein who were elected into office on April 9<sup>th</sup>. President Hettermann then announced his committee and public office appointments.

**Rose Subdivision** - At the May 2, 2013 meeting, the board performed a first review of the proposed development of property located on the west side of Route 31, south of Running Brook Farms Blvd. The property consists of approximately two acres of land which is being pursued for retail development. At the May 16<sup>th</sup> meeting the Board approved an Ordinance and Order granting a conditional use permit and approving the final plat for the development.

**NIGEC Agreement** - At the May 2, 2013 meeting the board performed a first review of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Northern Illinois Governmental Energy Cooperative. At the May 16<sup>th</sup> meeting the board approved the intergovernmental agreement. The Village will be participating in the cooperative to pursue the joint purchase of energy in an effort reduce cost on natural gas supply and street lighting.

### **Ordinances**

Chapter 2 Amendments - At the May 2, 2013 meeting the board performed a first review of amendments to Chapter 2 of the Johnsburg Municipal Code adding language regarding meeting participation. At the May 16, 2013 meeting the board approved the amendments.
